Overview:

Explain that Jehovah is one of Jesus' names before He received a body and came to earth. He is the one the scriptures talk about separating the light from the darkness, dividing the waters and land, and creating everything on the earth. He gave us this earth and made it beautiful to bring us joy and bless our lives.

Being a good steward means taking care of what has been given to you. We show reverence to Heavenly Father and Jesus by respecting and caring for Their creations.

Activity Ideas

Name three things that Jehovah created that make you happy. Explain why those things bring you joy. What can you do to help take care of those things?

For older children: Explain that Jehovah's creation extends to worlds without number and to the tiniest cells in our body. Show them the <u>clip from the movie Cosmic Voyage</u> that illustrates the vastness and wonder of these creations.

Treat Ideas

Make crispy rice treats in two pans, using blue food coloring in the marshmallow mixture of one, and green food coloring in the marshmallow mixture of the other. Have each child shape their own Earth creating oceans and continents.
